DIPLOMA IN TROPICAL MEDICINE & INTERNATIONAL HEALTH (DTMIH)

The post-graduate diploma in tropical medicine and International health (DTMIH) focuses on health-related challenges in low and middle-income settings. The interdisciplinary approach aims to provide students with knowledge in international and global health, covering global public health, infectious and non-communicable diseases, chronic diseases, health economics and politics. Furthermore, students will be trained in research methods and skills in order to conduct research for their MSc thesis.

- Enable participants to manage health problems in low- and middle-income-settings
- Enable participants to diagnose, treat and prevent diseases which are prevalent in low- and middle-income-settings

- Empower participants to generate knowledge and allow for informed decision making through the use of scientific tools
- Empower participants to employ research methods
