APPLICATION AND ADMISSION

Admission requirements

- Completed, first university degree of min. 240 ECTS credit points in a health-related science
- At least 2 years of work experience in the health-sector proven by references from (former) employers covering the candidate's work experience of at least 2 years
- English Language Proficiency: Level C1 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) evidenced by TOEFL 95-120; IELTS 6.5-7.5; native speaker or entire academic education in English

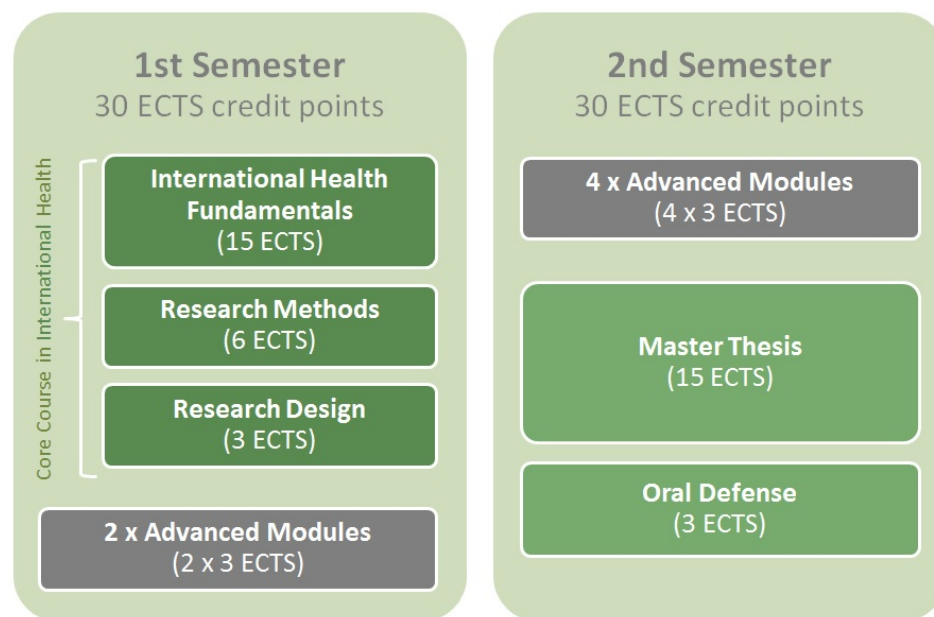

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN INTERNATIONAL HEALTH

The post-graduate Master's program in International Health (MSc IH) focuses on health-related challenges in low and middle-income settings. The interdisciplinary approach aims to provide students with knowledge in international and global health, covering global public health, infectious and non-communicable diseases, chronic diseases, health economics and politics. Furthermore, students will be trained in research methods and skills in order to conduct research for their MSc thesis.
