Dear Colleagues,

The International Network for Cooperation in Mental Health (i.nez), the Global Mental Health Group from the Department of Psychiatry and Psychotherapy of the Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität München (GMHG) and the Center for International Health (CIH-LMU), are organizing the 10th International Symposium on "Global Mental Health - Mental Health in Developing Countries". The symposium is open to all health professionals, medical anthropologists and students interested in the topic.

As early as 1993, the World Development Report - Investing in Health (WHO/ World Bank) estimated that neuropsychiatric disorders accounted for 10.5% of the global burden of disease (DALYs) and suggested that this could rise to 15% in 2020. Despite this striking prediction, mental disorders are still neglected.

The vast majority of people suffering from depression, dementia, epilepsy, schizophrenia, and substance abuse are living in Africa, Asia and Latin America. Most patients do not receive appropriate treatment – many are stigmatized, discriminated against, and socially excluded. This leads to serious psychological, physical, social, and economic damage for individuals, families and societies. Strengthening care and services for people with mental disorders is a global priority and demands additional investment alongside the political will to implement measures.

This year's symposium will focus on **Global Mental Health: The Past - The Present - The Future**. You are cordially invited to join.
