From August 22 to September 2; 2016 the 2<sup>nd</sup> CIH Summer School took place in Munich. 22 Participants from nine different countries such as Colombia, Peru, Ecuador, Mexico, Indonesia, Ghana, Philippine, Nigeria und India were part of this great Summer School.

The participants are able to identify intervention needs from the results of epidemiologic studies, identify the best target populations for a teaching intervention, set up a structured concept for a teaching intervention, develop appropriate learning objectives for a teaching intervention, plan and apply modern teaching methods, implement teaching interventions in their home country, and evaluate teaching interventions.

## Exceed Conference Berlin 2016



Refugees and migration - these topics have dominated the headlines in any news since summer 2015. The United Nations refugee agency currently counts more than 65 million people who are fleeing the world - mainly in their own country. But what are the causes of migration and do they relate to war conflicts and water deficits? Is a dignified existence possible in the refugee camps? How do migrants deal with the influx of refugees and what is the responsibility of the international community?

These questions were the focus of the conference "Forced Migration - Environmental and Socio-economic Dimensions", which the five German universities of the DAAD program

"Hochschullexzellenz in der Entwicklungszusammenarbeit - exceed" invited to Berlin on 19 and 20 October. The TU Braunschweig, the LMU Munich, the TH Cologne and the Universities of Kassel and Hohenheim, together with their 37 partner institutions in Africa, Asia and South America, form a network that the DAAD has been funding since 2009 - from funds of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ). Over 120 scientists from all over the world had travelled to Berlin, which made it clear where research on migration can become even better. "We need to involve the affected ones even more so that we can make the right conclusions", said Professor Lars Ribbe from the TH Cologne.

## Workshop on Project Management Fundamentals



The workshop took place from the August 22 to 26 2016 at the Universidade Catolica de Mocambique (UCM) in Beira, Mozambique. 13 participants (9 male and 4 female) from Kenya, Mocambique, Italy, and Egypt improved competencies of a project manager in the scientific context by differentiating hard and soft aspects of project management, define SMART project missions and goals, describe the project lifecycle, define project organization, roles and responsibilities, challenges like how to set up project requirements and kick-offs, structure and plan projects using adequate PM tools, evaluate and manage risks and stakeholders, propose lateral leadership, and handle intercultural aspects of project management professionally were discussed.

"I could understand what a project is, and how complex it can be; this workshop made me understand how I can manage not just a project, but that my life is a project. I really liked the lesson about risk management, and the Marshmallow challenge", a workshop participant commented.
